District, Regional, State and National Extracurricular Events
Guide for Charging Expenses

I. COMPETITIVE EVENTS

District & Regional Events:

- General Fund pays transportation costs for participants, advisors and coaches
- Lodging and meals only if overnight stay is required

(Note: Pep band typically does not stay overnight for district and regional events)

State Events (students or teams qualify through regional competitions and compete in at least one event at the state level):

- General Fund pays lodging, meals, transportation and registration fees for participants and advisors/coaches

National Events (students or teams qualify through state competitions and compete in at least one event at the national level):

- General Fund pays 50% of transportation and 50% of lodging expenses for participants and all costs for one advisor
- Individual ASB Fund, Athletics, Class, or Club accounts pay for remaining participant expenses.

II. NON-COMPETITIVE EVENTS

(Does not include secondary class field trips; i.e., Senior Trip)

Regional, State, National Meetings/Conferences/Conventions: (i.e. F.F.A)

- Individual ASB, Class and Club accounts pay for all expenses for student participants. (food, lodging, transportation)
- General Fund pays all costs for one advisor including substitute costs.
- National events are limited to once per high school career for each program.

Student Elected to State/National Office – Representative at State and National Meetings/Conferences/Conventions:

- General Fund pays 50% of transportation and 50% of lodging expenses for participants and all costs for one advisor including substitute costs
- ASB Fund Athletics, Class, Club account pays for remaining expenses for participants

III. CLASS & CLUB FIELD TRIPS AND END-OF-THE-YEAR TRIPS

- All expenses are the responsibility of individual class or club. Participants may be required to do fundraising to secure sufficient funds to cover expenses
- Approval of the trip and fundraising activities according to district policy and procedures must occur prior to the commencement of fundraising activities.
- Fundraising does not involve soliciting money from the general fund

IV. LEADERSHIP ACTIVITIES

- Honor Society: supported by general fund once every two years with transportation and one meal for students and one advisor. Support also covers substitute costs for one advisor.
- ASB Elected Officers: Because ASB elected officers are required by the district to attend leadership camps, general funds will support all costs.

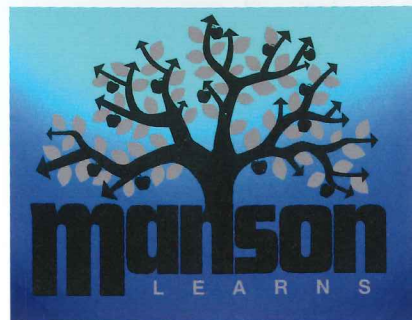

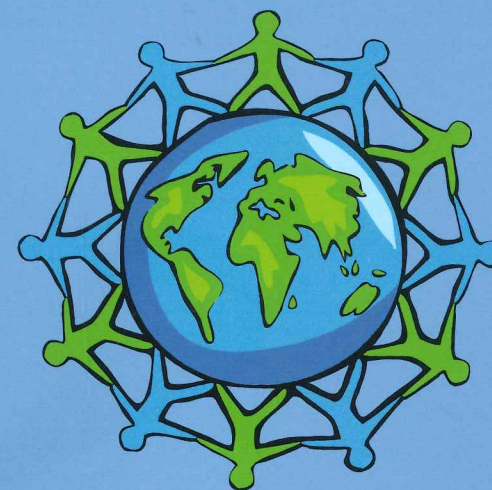
